BANSHEE

A banshee is a female spirit in Irish folklore who heralds the death of a family member, usually by screaming, wailing, or shrieking of keening. Her name is connected to the mythologically important túnaí that surrounded the Irish countryside, which was known as "tána" in Old Irish.



Etymology

The English word banshee is derived from the Irish "bean síne", which translates literally to "woman of the hills". In modern usage, however, "bean síne" has come to mean "woman of the fairies". While many of us tend to think of the banshee as more of a ghost or a spirit, her name really means that she is technically a fairy.

Origin

The first known mention of the banshee in literature was in 1880, with the publication of *Cathleen in the Kesh* by Seán Mac Coillín. The story tells of an experience where two people were the victims of the banshee in the middle of the night. She was calling for "The woman", the next morning they discovered that a servant named Rosemary had died.

Description

Sometimes she has long, wavy hair and wears a grey cloak over a green dress, and her eyes are said to glow with a red light. She may be dressed in white with red hair and a ghastly complexion. In Ireland and parts of Scotland, a traditional part of mourning is the keening, where women wail. This keening woman may or may not be a professional and the best keeners were highly demanded.

Reason

She would cry when a family member died or was about to die, even if the person was not family and news of their death was not come yet. She is also a predictor of death.
